- Children are welcomed and encouraged to join us in the worship service. We provide a nursery for infants on the main floor and childcare for toddlers in the basement for the duration of worship.
 - Pre-K Activities: Following the Passing of the Peace, Pre-school through Kindergarten aged children are invited to line up in the Narthex for class lasting until communion.
- During the season of Easter, it is traditional to sing a Gospel acclamation that employs the Easter cry, "Hallelujah!" This year at ResCov, we will be using an Alleluia from the Palestinian Christian community as a way to lift up their stories and pray for the peace of all of our siblings in the Holy Land.
- During the season of Easter, the Gospel is read from the middle of the sanctuary, reminding us that Christ died and was raised in the midst of us that we might be saved. As a symbol of our response to the risen Christ, we turn to face the Gospel during its reading.
- *Uyai Mose/Come All You People* is a song based off of Psalm 66:1 whose melody and first verse (in Shona) were written by Zimbabwean Alexander Gondo.
- Originally written in Czech ("Nebojte se"), "Be Not Afraid" is a song from the Taizé community of France.
- The bulletin art is a third-century depiction of Christ as the good shepherd uncovered in the Roman catacombs of San Callisto.
