- Children are welcomed and encouraged to join us in the worship service. We provide a nursery for infants on the main floor and childcare for toddlers in the basement for the duration of worship.
 - Pre-K Activities: Following the Passing of the Peace, Pre-school through Kindergarten aged children are invited to line up in the Narthex for class lasting until communion.
- "I'm Gonna Eat at the Welcome Table" is an African-American spiritual that depicts the inclusive welcome of the great banquet of God's kingdom. As a song composed and sung first by a people enslaved, it is also a call to work for justice to all who still are not welcome at the tables of our world.
- "Come All You Vagabonds (Vagabonds)" is a song written by Stuart Townend, Mark Edwards, and Phil Baggaley. The song is based on the parable of Luke 14:15-24 where a host invites a group of friends to a banquet he is throwing. When they make excuses for why they cannot come, the host tells his servants to go out into the streets and invite anyone they see.
- "Hallelujah, We Sing Your Praises" comes from South Africa and originated in the Sotho language. It spread globally via the Swedish collection *Freedom Is Coming: Songs of Protest and Praise from South Africa* (1984).

The season of Epiphany begins on January 6th after the 12 days of Christmas. Epiphany (meaning "appearance" or "manifestation") celebrates the coming of the Magi to worship Jesus, the Light of the world, after his birth. In doing so, the Magi became the first Gentiles to identify Jesus as King. It serves as a marker for the inclusivity of the Gospel for all people. The stars that hang from the front of the sanctuary reminds us of the that star that first called the Magi to Jesus and calls us to worship the Light of the world that has come into our midst and called all people to worship that Light.
