- Children are welcomed and encouraged to join us in the worship service. We provide a nursery for infants on the main floor and childcare for toddlers in the basement for the duration of worship.
 - Pre-K Activities: Following the Passing of the Peace, Pre-school through Kindergarten aged children are invited to line up in the Narthex for class lasting until communion.
- During Black History Month, we will sing the traditional African American tune for the doxology, which you can find as an insert in your bulletin.
- "Woke Up This Morning" is a traditional African-American gospel song. During the Civil Rights movement, the song gained new life when its title was adapted to sing, "Woke up this mornin' with my mind stayed on freedom."
- "The Summons" is a song written by Scottish songwriters John Bell and Graham Maule. It was written to mark the conclusion of youth volunteers after a year of service. Like many of Bell's hymns, it uses non-traditional language to speak of the call of justice that Christians are called to follow.

The season of Epiphany begins on January 6th after the 12 days of Christmas. Epiphany (meaning "appearance" or "manifestation") celebrates the coming of the Magi to worship Jesus, the Light of the world, after his birth. In doing so, the Magi became the first Gentiles to identify Jesus as King. It serves as a marker for the inclusivity of the Gospel for all people. The stars that hang from the front of the sanctuary reminds us of the that star that first called the Magi to Jesus and calls us to worship the Light of the world that has come into our midst and called all people to worship that Light.
