- "O Love That Will Not Let Me Go" is a hymn text written by Church of Scotland minister George Matheson. Matheson lost his eyesight in early adulthood. As a result, his sister became one of his primary caretakers. The day before his sister was to get married, and no doubt anxious about what his sister's marriage would mean for his care, he sat down and wrote this text on the unfailing love of God. He wrote the text in five minutes without any further revisions.
- The hymn "Stand by Me" ("When the Storms of Life Are Raging") is by one of the fathers of gospel music, Charles A. Tindley. "Stand by Me" is one of his most well-known and speaks to the struggles, hopes, and prayers of the African-American community of the late-nineteenth and early-twentieth centuries that continue to this day. As we sing it, we bear witness to their story and are challenged and comforted by its call on our lives.

The season of **Lent** begins on Ash Wednesday and runs the 40 days before Easter (not counting Sundays) representing Christ's 40 days in the wilderness in preparation for ministry as well as symbolizing the 40 years the Israelites spent wandering in the desert. It began in the 5th century as the final period of preparation for new Christians who would be baptized on Easter. It is a season of preparation for Holy Week and Easter often marked by penitence, almsgiving, and practices of self-denial, such as fasting. The color of Lent is purple representing suffering and penitence as well as the royalty of Christ.
