WORSHIP NOTES:

- Children are welcomed and encouraged to join us in the worship service. During the summer, we provide a nursery for infants (unstaffed) on the main floor and childcare for toddlers in the basement for the duration of worship.
 - Pre-K Activities: Following the Passing of the Peace, pre-school through Kindergarten-aged children are invited to line up in the Narthex for class lasting until communion.
- "Kwake Yesu Nasimama/Here on Jesus Christ I Will Stand" is a Kenyan (Swahili) adaptation of the hymn "My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less."
- "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" is a text by 18th-century Robert Robinson. He wrote the text at 22 years old, and it quickly became a renowned hymn. Yet, he too went through periods of deep doubt. Later in life, he apparently heard a woman humming the hymn, and when she asked him if he liked it, he responded, "Madam, I am the poor unhappy man who wrote that hymn many years ago, and I would give a thousand worlds, if I had them, to enjoy the feelings I had then."
- "In a Deep, Unbounded Darkness" is a translation by Mary Louise (Mel) Bringle of an anonymous Chinese poem. As the PCUSA hymnal *Glory to God* notes, "setting this translation of a Chinese hymn to a Western plainsong (the 13th-century tune DIVINUM MYSTERIUM) enhances the universal context of the opening stanza."
- The bulletin art is entitled "Sarah and the Angels" by Franco-Russian artist Marc Chagall.

Ordinary Time is the span of the church calendar that runs between Eastertide and Advent. It received its name not because of its ordinariness, but from the word "ordinal" which simply means counted. It is the time also known as the Season of the Church where we celebrate the growth and mission of the Church through the work of Christ. Because the themes of growth and new life are so prevalent, the color of the season is green.
