


We are an imperfect community striving to live into the beautiful story of God in our wonderful yet broken city. We invite you to join us as we seek God's glory and neighbor's good together!

- Children are welcomed and encouraged to join us in the worship service. We provide a nursery for infants (unstaffed) on the main floor and childcare for toddlers in the basement for the duration of worship.
 - Pre-K-2nd Grade Activities: Following the Passing of the Peace, pre-school through 2nd-grade-aged children are invited to line up in the Narthex for class lasting until communion.
- "Ipharadisi" is a traditional Zulu song originating from South Africa. It came to the rest of the world when it was included in the 1984 *Freedom Is Coming: Songs of Protest and Praise from South Africa*, which included other now famous songs like "Siyahamba/We Are Marching," "Halleluyah, Pelo Tsa Rona/Hallelujah, We Sing Your Praises," and "Thuma Mina/Send me, Jesus."
- "Tu Fidelidad" is a short Spanish chorus by Miguel Cassina based on Lamentations 3:22-23: "The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."
- "For All The Saints" is a text by nineteenth-century English bishop William How. Its popularity soared when it was set to the tune SINE NOMINE composed by Ralph Vaughn Williams, and it is traditionally used on All Saints' Day and funeral services.
- The bulletin image is a photo of a Mexican cemetery during the celebration of *El Día de los Muertos*.

Ordinary Time is the span of the church calendar that runs between Eastertide and Advent. It received its name not because of its ordinariness, but from the word "ordinal" which simply means counted. It is the time also known as the Season of the Church where we celebrate the growth and mission of the Church through the work of Christ. Because the themes of growth and new life are so prevalent, the color of the season is green.
